### **Suicide Prevention Curriculum Grant**

Questions received as of October 7, 2024 Ohio Department of Higher Education

1. The College is not in a position to add a new course for Spring 2025. Without knowing all that is involved with the curriculum, is it feasible to incorporate the curriculum into an existing course? And is this permissible to meet the grant requirements?

Response: The curriculum must be implemented in the Spring 2025 term and cannot be incorporated into an existing course.

### 2. Does this involve bringing in an outside trainer who is skilled in this program, or should the institutions think of this as a train-the-trainer experience?

Response: The Ohio Suicide Prevention Foundation does not provide training to teach the curriculum. The curriculum should be taught by someone (faculty or staff) at the institution with related subject matter expertise. ### 6. How many faculty are we allowed to train and are allowed to provide the course? This affects our budget.

Response: There is no training provided to teach the curriculum. The curriculum should be taught by someone (faculty or staff) at the institution with related subject matter expertise.
