Can we apply for funds to take a group of students to the annual Interfaith Leadership Summit, that is sponsored by Interfaith America

Response: The Campus Community Grant has been provided to institutions to share with institutionally sanctioned organizations that are committed to supporting intergroup and interfaith outreach and cultural competency. Each request for funding within an application must provide support regarding eligibility of the students participating/benefiting and evidence the funds are used for supporting intergroup and interfaith outreach and cultural competency.

Will multiple applications from one institution be considered?

Response: Yes.

Can an application be made by multiple registered students who would like to work together on an applicable project?

Response: Multiple institutionally sanctioned student organizations can apply for funds through the Campus Community Grant. Student organizations may propose to work together towards a common goal under the same application.

Is the institution responsible for notifying all student organizations of this grant opportunity?

Response: The Campus Community Grant has been provided to institutions to share with institutionally sanctioned organizations that are committed to supporting intergroup and interfaith outreach and cultural competency.

Is the appropriate Vice President expected to vet and forward the application that has institutional support?

Response: The letter from the Vice President or equivalent must certify that the student organization applying for funding is institutionally sanctioned, as defined by ODHE in the Campus Community Grant (RFP), and that the institution is prepared to support the student organization with all grant accounting and reporting requirements to be set forth in the award agreement if funds are awarded.
